Discover the variety of native plants local to our area; plants that are suited to our hot, dry climate, which also provide food, shelter and habitat for our native butterflies, birds, lizards and insects, and add beauty and interest to our gardens.

Ground covers (plants that grow along the ground, trailing or suckering)

» <i>Acacia cupularis</i>	Coastal Umbrella Bush	Important host plant for Two-spotted Line Blue Butterfly Provides nectar and shelter for birds
» <i>Atriplex cinerea</i>	Coast Saltbush / Grey Saltbush	Important food plant for caterpillars of Saltbush Blue Butterfly
<i>Atriplex paludosa</i>	Marsh Saltbush	
» <i>Enchylaena tomentosa</i>	Ruby Saltbush	Food source for birds
<i>Adriana quadripartita</i>	Coast Bitterbush	Exclusive food for Bitterbush Blue Butterfly
<i>Senecio</i> sp.	Groundsel	Butterfly larval food plant
» <i>Leucopogon parviflorus</i>	Coast Beard Heath	Food source for birds
» <i>Leucophyta brownii</i>	Cushion Bush	Butterflies & insects
» <i>Olearia axillaris</i>	Coast Daisy-Bush	Valuable habitat for butterflies, birds & insects
» <i>Rhagodia candolleana</i>	Sea-berry Saltbush	Butterfly larva food plant & birds feed on berries
» <i>Nitraria billardierei</i>	Nitre Bush	Food source for birds
<i>Maireana brevifolia</i>	Short-leaf Bluebush	

**Large shrub** (shrub more than 2.5m high)

<i>Santalum acuminatum</i>	Quandong/ Native Peach	
» <i>Acacia ligulata</i>	Umbrella Bush	Nectar and shelter for birds
» <i>Acacia longifolia</i> ssp. <i>Sophorae</i>	Coastal Wattle	
<i>Melaleuca halmaturorum</i>	SA Swamp Paperbark	
<i>Melaleuca lanceolata</i>	Moonah, Black Tea Tree	Food source for birds & butterflies
<i>Myoporum insulare</i>	Native Juniper	Food source for birds & butterflies
» <i>Bursaria spinosa</i>	Christmas Bush / Sweet Bursaria	Insect attracting
» <i>Dodonaea viscosa</i>	Sticky Hop-Bush	Food source for butterflies

**Small trees** (trees that grow 5m to 10m high)

<i>Avicennia marina</i>	Grey Mangrove	
<i>Callitris gracilis</i>	Southern Cypress Pine	Several parrot species feed on fruit
» <i>Allocasuarina verticillata</i>	Drooping Sheoak	Food source for birds & butterflies
» <i>Banksia marginata</i>	Silver Banksia	Food source for birds & butterflies
<i>Banksia ornata</i>	Desert Banksia	Food source for birds & butterflies
<i>Pittosporum angustifolium</i>	Native Apricot	Food source for birds
<i>Acacia pycnantha</i>	Golden Wattle	
<i>Eucalyptus porosa</i>	Mallee Box	Food source for birds & butterflies

**Large trees** (trees that grow to 10m or more)

<i>Eucalyptus leucoxylon</i>	SA Blue Gum	Food source for birds & butterflies
