Form: Groundcover **Height:** 0.1 – 0.2 m **Spread:** 0.4 – 0.5 m **Flowers:** Blue **Type:** Bell **Flowering time:** Spring, Autumn

Ecological functions:



Soils: sand, clay or loam; acidic, alkaline or neutral

Germination rate: 3 to 4 weeks

Seed collecting: bend dry heads over into a container. Shake stems to dislodge seeds, many fine seeds will fall out.

Seed treatment: none

Sowing requirements: sprinkle fine seeds over propagating soil. Keep moist. Place under misting system, in warm area. Sow in Spring or Autumn. Requires well-drained soils.

Position: full sun

Supplementary watering: moderate

Uses: an ornamental perennial herb with well displayed flowers. Can be planted en mass as a showy display in raised beds or borders or as an understorey planting. Attracts nectar eating birds and insects.
